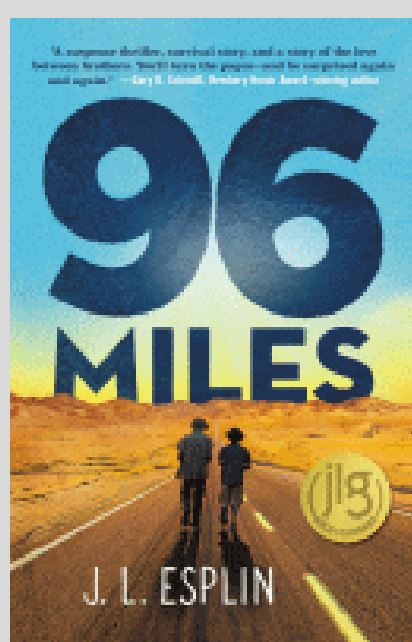




MIDDLE SCHOOL SUMMER READING 2023

While the titles in this list are all age appropriate and have been selected specifically for middle school students from 10-13 years of age, these selections span a diverse and inclusive range of reading levels, maturity levels, and cultural areas for middle grade children. Books marked as "middle grade" are appropriate for all middle school students. Books marked as "upper grades" or "high school/young adult crossover" are appropriate for grades 7 and up. 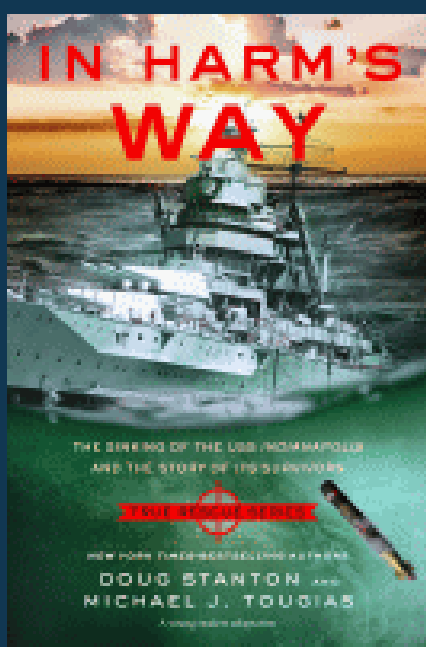
96 MILES by *ESPLIN, J L*

Fiction: action/adventure **Interest Level: Middle grade**

From the publisher: "21 days without power. 2 brothers on a desperate trek. 72 hours before time runs out..."

The Lockwood brothers are supposed to be able to survive anything. Their dad, a hardcore believer in self-reliance, has stockpiled enough food and water at their isolated Nevada home to last for months. But when they are robbed of all their supplies during a massive blackout while their dad is out of town, John and Stew must walk 96 miles in the stark desert sun to get help. Along the way, they're forced to question their dad's insistence on self-reliance and ask just what it is that we owe to our neighbors, to our kin, and to ourselves.

From talented newcomer J. L. Esplin comes this story of survival and determination as two young brothers confront the unpredictability of human nature in the face of desperate circumstances."



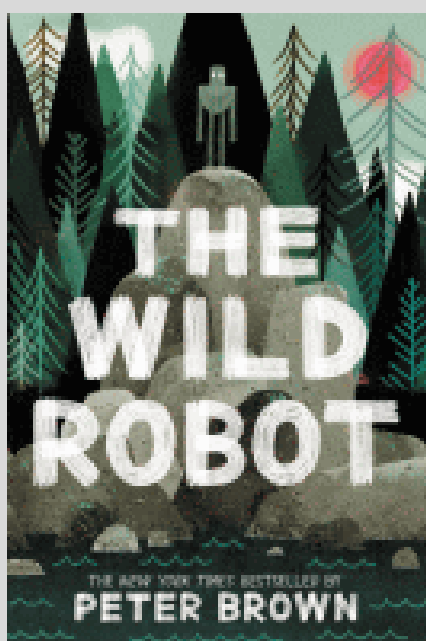

Nonfiction: survival, history **Interest Level: Upper middle grade-high school/young adult crossover**

From the publisher: "On July 30, 1945, the U.S.S. Indianapolis was torpedoed in the South Pacific by a Japanese submarine. An estimated 300 men were killed upon impact; close to 900 sailors were cast into the Pacific Ocean, where they remained undetected by the navy for nearly four days and nights. Battered by a savage sea, they struggled to stay alive, fighting off sharks, hypothermia, and hallucinations.

By the time rescue arrived, all but 316 men had died. The captain's subsequent court-martial left many questions unanswered: How did the navy fail to realize the Indianapolis was missing? And how did these 316 men manage to survive against all odds?

ESCAPE by ALEXANDER, K R

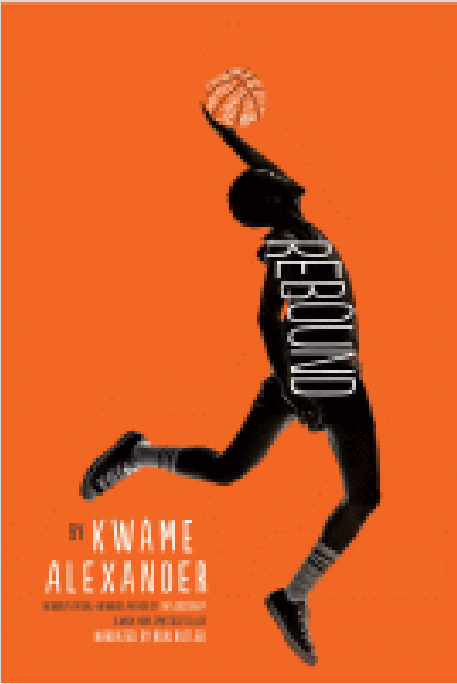
Fiction: horror and suspense Interest level: Middle grade

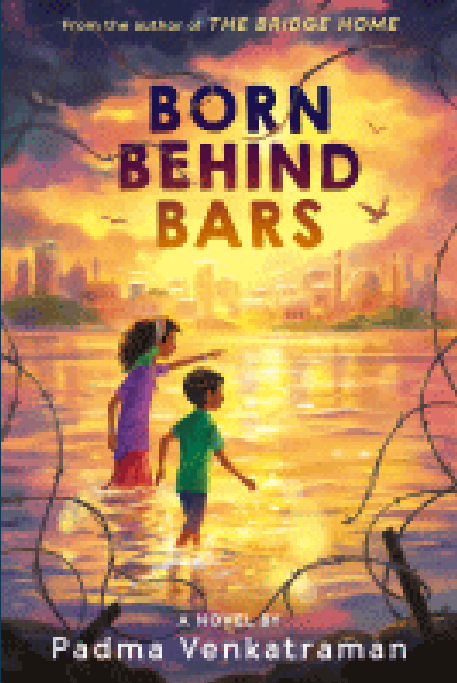

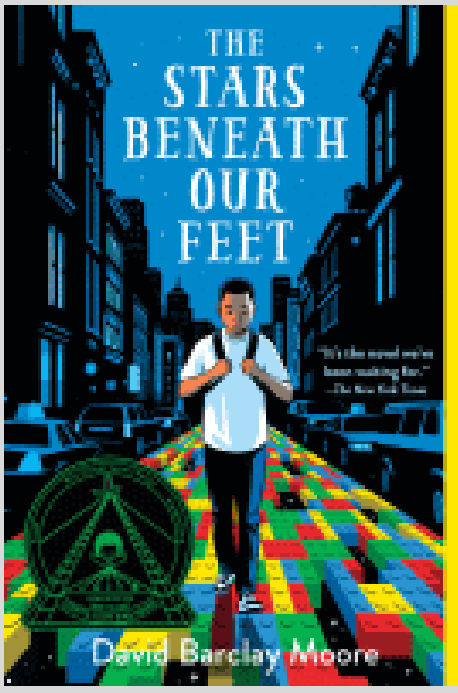


BORN BEHIND BARS by VENKATRAMAN, PADMA

Fiction: realistic Interest level: Middle grade

Kabir has been in jail since the day he was born, because his mom is serving time for a crime she didn't commit. He's never met his dad, so the only family he's got are their cellmates, and the only place he feels the least bit free is in the classroom, where his kind teacher regales him with stories of the wonders of the outside world. Then one day a new warden arrives and announces Kabir is too old to stay. He gets handed over to a long-lost "uncle" who unfortunately turns out to be a fraud, and intends to sell Kabir. So Kabir does the only thing he can--run away as fast as his legs will take him. How does a boy with nowhere to go and no connections make his way? Fortunately, he befriends Rani, another street kid, and she takes him under her wing. But plotting their next move is hard--and fraught with danger--in a world that cares little for homeless, low caste children. This is not the world Kabir dreamed of--but he's discovered he's not the type to give up. Kabir is ready to show the world that he--and his mother--deserve a place in it."



THE STARS BENEATH OUR FEET by MOORE, DAVID BARCLAY

Fiction: realistic Interest Level: Middle grade

From the publisher: "It's Christmas Eve in Harlem, but twelve-year-old Lolly Rachpaul and his mom aren't celebrating. They're still reeling from his older brother's death in a gang-related shooting just a few months earlier. Then Lolly's mother's girlfriend brings him a gift that will change everything: two enormous bags filled with Legos. Fiction: realistic Interest level: Middle grade

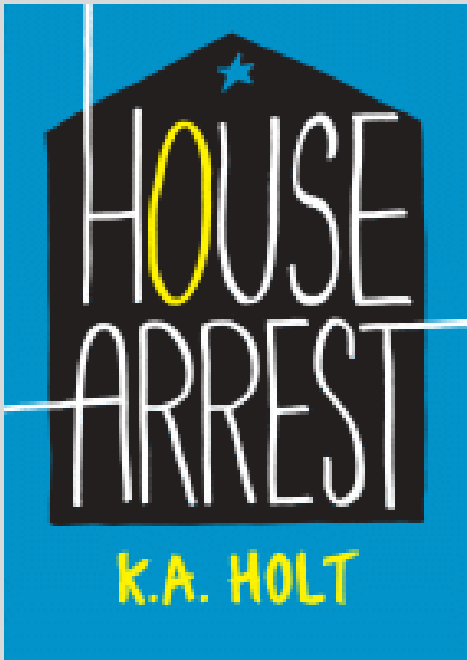

Cash, Fitch, and Bird Nelson Thomas are three siblings in seventh grade together in Park, Delaware. In 1986, as the country waits expectantly for the launch of the space shuttle Challenger, they each struggle with their own personal anxieties. Cash, who loves basketball but has a newly broken wrist, is in danger of failing seventh grade for the second time. Fitch spends every afternoon playing Major Havoc at the arcade on Main and wrestles with an explosive temper that he doesn't understand. And Bird, his twelve-year-old twin, dreams of being NASA's first female shuttle commander, but feels like she's disappearing.

The Nelson Thomas children exist in their own orbits, circling a tense and unpredictable household, with little in common except an enthusiastic science teacher named Ms. Salonga. As the launch of the Challenger approaches, Ms. Salonga gives her students a project—they are separated into spacecraft crews and must create and complete a mission. When the fated day finally arrives, it changes all of their lives and brings them together in unexpected ways.

Told in three alternating points of view, We Dream of Space is an unforgettable and thematically rich novel for middle grade readers.

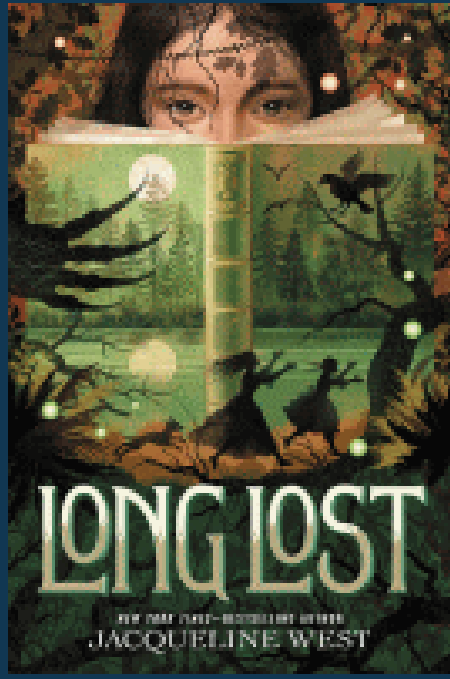

Fiction: realistic Interest Level: Middle grade

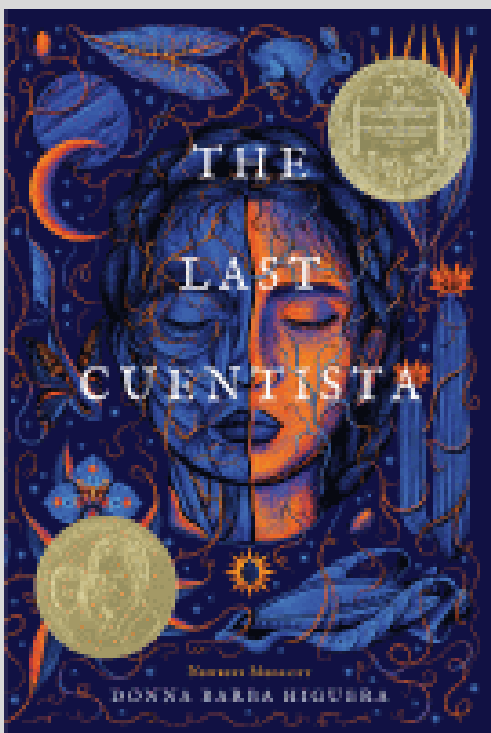
LONG LOST by WEST, JACQUELINE

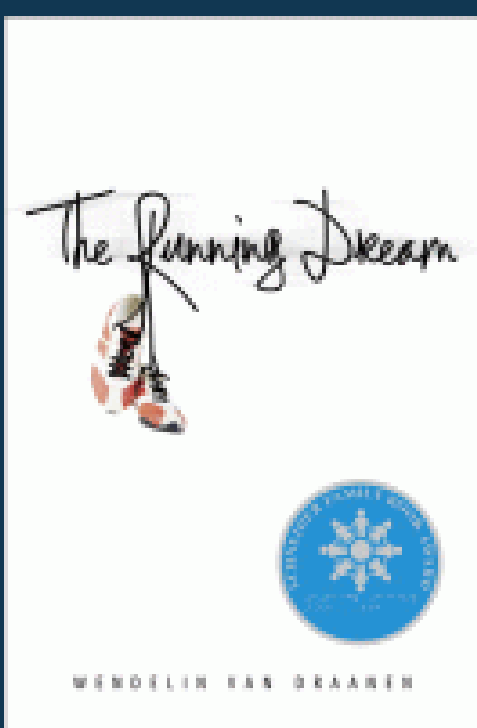

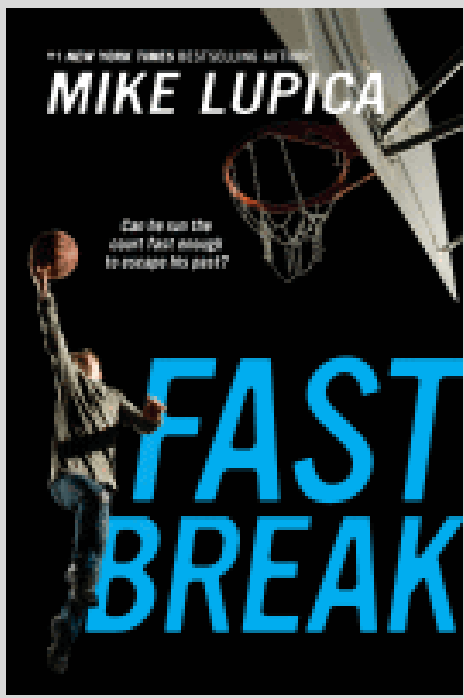

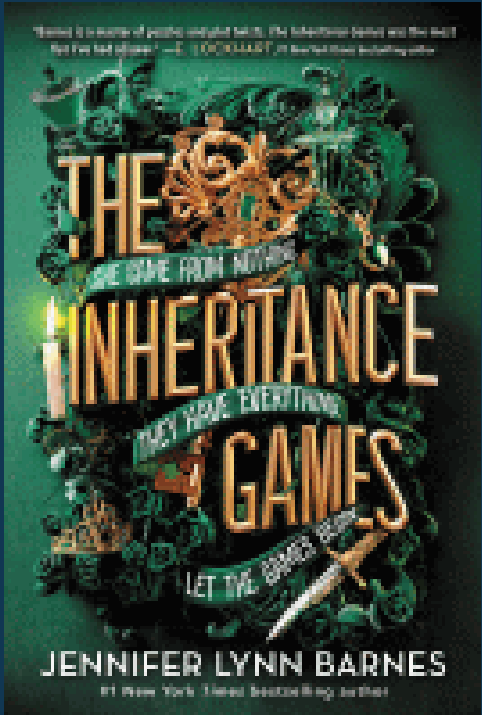


FAST BREAK by LUPICA, MIKE

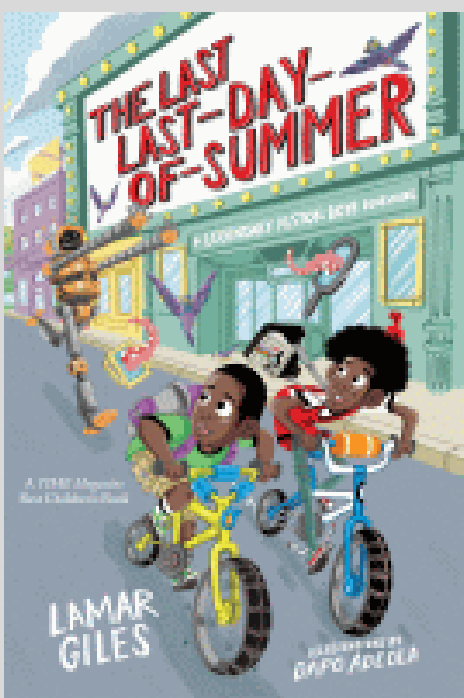


THE INHERITANCE GAMES by BARNES, JENNIFER LYNN

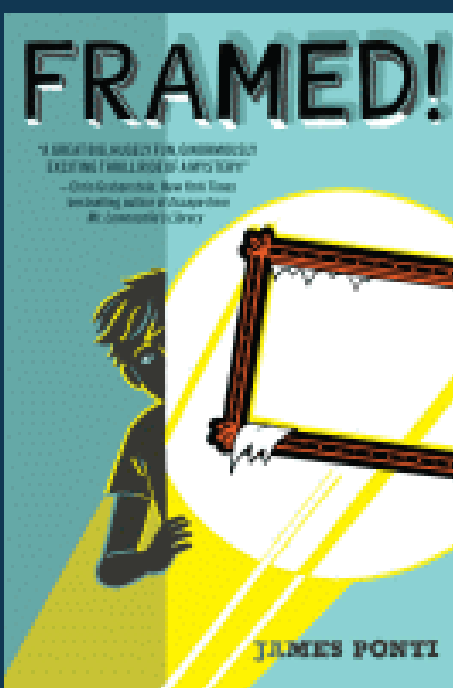
THE LAST LAST-DAY-OF-SUMMER by by GILES, LAMAR

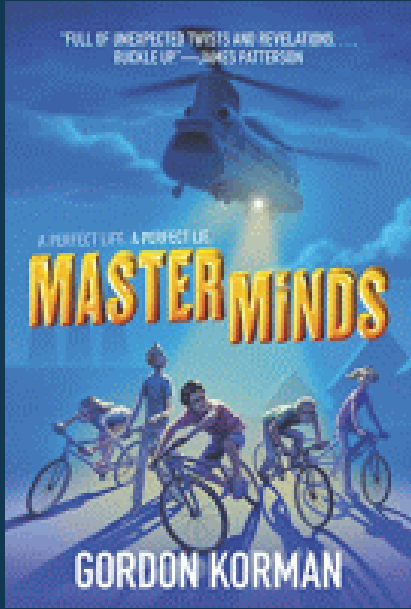
SOLIMAR : THE SWORD OF THE MONARCHS by RYAN, PAM MUNOZ

Even with help, can Solimar save her family, the kingdom, and the future of the monarchs from a greedy king?"



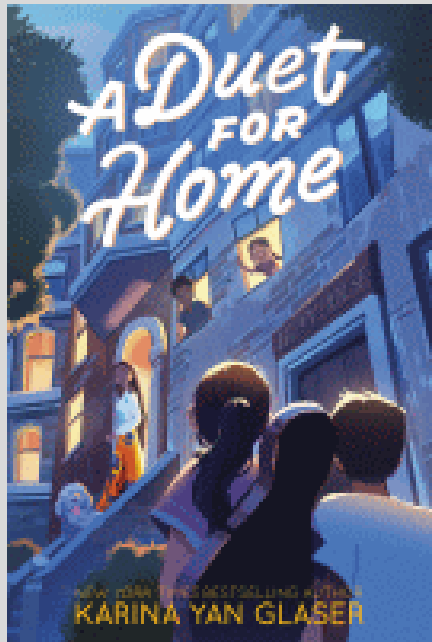
MASTERMINDS by KORMAN, GORDON

The kids realize they can trust no one—least of all their own parents."



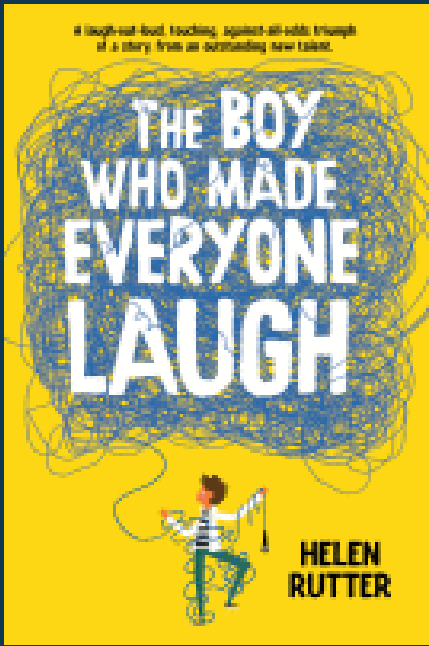
A DUET FOR HOME by GLASER, KARINA YAN

Can he and June work together to oppose the government, or will families be forced out of Huey House before they are ready?"



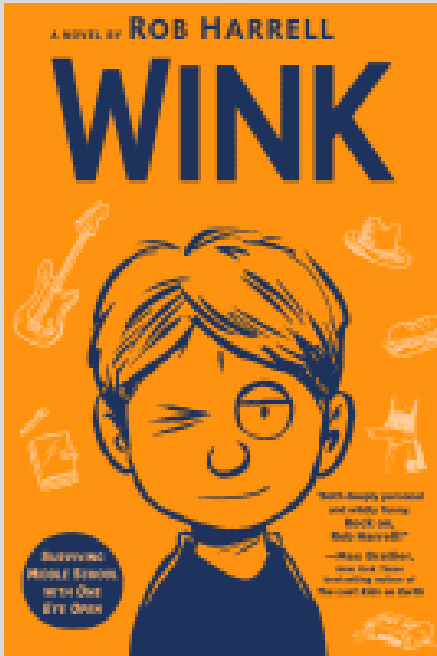
THE BOY WHO MADE EVERYONE LAUGH by RUTTER, HELEN

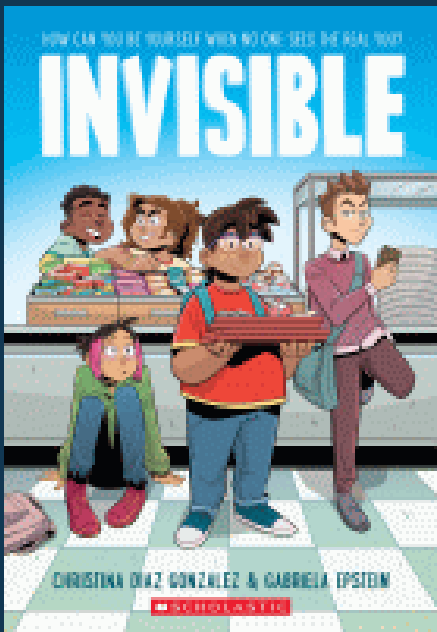
WINK by HARRELL, ROB
